

# The Diaconate

Over the last few weeks, you may have noticed a bulletin announcement regarding the Deacon Ministry. Some may be wondering what is a deacon, and what does being a deacon encompass. A deacon reminded me that we are not volunteers, but people called to vocational service in the image of Christ the Servant. I remember when Deacon Dick baptized my daughter LisaMarie, and I thought he did a wonderful job. I recall seeing deacons assisting the priest at Mass in a seamless manner, but I was not sure what other responsibilities they had as deacons. These are some of the thoughts I had when discerning whether I was being called to be a deacon.

Deacon Jack approached me one day after Mass, and asked me if I was interested in considering the Deacon Ministry. By the way, Deacon Jack also approached Deacon Tom and Deacon Nilo asking them if they would consider the Diaconate. The process was comprehensive and after a four year course of study, I was ordained a deacon in May, 2016. Deacons receive the Sacrament of Holy Orders; we are members of the Clergy.

Over the course of almost nine years as a deacon, I have had an opportunity to be placed in charge of the Homebound Ministry, bringing Holy Eucharist to the homebound, along with over a half dozen Eucharistic Ministers. My wife and I were in charge of the Pre-Cana Ministry. I had already been a co-chair for the Italian Feast when I was ordained, so they just put the title Deacon in front of my name. I also inherited from Deacon Tom, the El Salvador Mission Trip and the Casa House project.

Some of the other tasks I share with my deacon brothers are: Baptism intakes, Baptisms, Wake Services, Committal Services, officiating at Wedding Ceremonies, Tuesday Eucharistic Adoration and first Saturday of the month Nocturnal Adoration. We preside at the blessing of the Christmas Tree, we submit articles or letters to the bulletin, lead Prayer Services, Morning Prayer during Holy Week, and we preach on the last weekend of the month. I am sure my brother deacons will gently remind me if I left anything out. I have not yet had the privilege of Blessing the Animals, really looking forward to that!

Deacon Jack will be celebrating twenty-three years as a deacon this year. He has been MC at Confirmation Masses, and part of the following committees: buildings and grounds, as well as the finance and liturgy committees. Deacon Tom will be celebrating seventeen years as a deacon, and has been involved with Diaconate Formation, a member of the Life Center of Long Island, and heads our Baptism Ministry. Deacon Nilo who will soon celebrate four years as a deacon, leads our Respect Life Committee and is a part of the Art and Environment Committee. Our deacons are quite busy as you can see; I hope this sheds some light on the diaconate and some of our many rewarding duties.

As always, we thank our Pastor for letting us actively participate within the Parish Community.



The meetings will be on Tuesdays in the Parish Center at 1:00pm or at 7:30pm in the All Purpose Room depending on which session works best for you. The dates are May 13, 20, 27, June 3, 10, 17, 24. The facilitator training will be Tuesday, May 6<sup>th</sup> at 1:00pm and 7:00pm in the Parish Center. A \$30.00 per person donation will cover the cost of materials. However, in lieu of the \$30.00 fee, a free will offering is greatly appreciated if the cost creates a hardship. All are welcome.

The study/retreat will begin on May 13<sup>th</sup> which is the Feast of our Lady of Fatima. May is also the month of Our Lady. The last day of the study/retreat is Tuesday, June 24<sup>th</sup>, which will be the Mass and Consecration to Our Lady. The last day happens to be the anniversary of the day that Our Lady appeared to children in Medjugorje for the first time on June 24, 1981.

As an adult she founded schools, hospitals, and orphanages in more than 40 locations for immigrants across three continents, but she never made it to the Far East. 


