





#### **Around the Parish**

Hello, 2025! My thoughts, hopes and prayers for each of you are that you felt and knew God's love and grace in your hearts this holiday, and that you will carry it with you as we face our journey in this new year. I really never know where I'll be lead or what I'll share here, but these past mornings our prayer space has been calling me.

I was drawn to Our Lady of Lourdes for many reasons. The fact that I found God's house in the midst of homes was powerful. Upon entering, there was a warmth and definitely a welcoming feeling. My daughter, Jamie, and I instantly became members. In case you missed it, I am a visual learner and the elements around certain things jump out to me. I would like to share my experiences and love for our prayer space. In the mid 80's, a renovation took place. It was a concern that so many were so far away from the altar, and to encourage active participation, the altar was placed where it is today. Yes, as you can imagine, many were not happy.

As you enter our prayer space in the narthex, you are greeted by Mary! She stands there welcoming us into her Son's home, with the light and warmth from the candles. She tells us, "all are welcomed". Many years later, Deacon John DeGuardi painted Christ with His open arms leading the way. As you come down the main aisle, you become members of the church at the Baptismal font. We are seated and nurtured by the Word of God proclaimed from the ambo. Then we come to the altar, where we are nourished by the Eucharist.

We are all much closer now so that we can hear, see and share in the Mass. Originally, the altar was by the narthex doors and the entrance was located where the large stain glass Pentecost window is now. The ceiling of our building remained the same dark wood it is today. All the light oak is new. The significance of that speaks to me... the old ceiling, the Old Testament (Hebrew scripture), all the new lighter wood the New Testament (Christian scripture). Then we come to the altar area. The large area where the cross hangs so majestically (again the light wood of the New Testament) brings us to the gift He gave us at the last supper...the TABLE and the continuation of that sacrifice and gift, the Eucharist.

There are two other things I'd like to bring to light. The Pentecost window; when the morning sun hits it and the window dances with beautiful color and the images come alive. The Holy Spirit in the form of the Dove and the twelve flames, again the Spirit coming alive in each of the Apostles and, of course, the Lily representing Our Lady. In the beginning, the Blessed Sacrament reposed in this area. It was called the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. It was a lovely prayer space. Now, each season, it has a special theme leading us to prayer and quiet time. The last item I would like to share is the body of Christ which hangs above the altar, is NOT the original one. It was a modern (some called it a Polynesian) Christ. Really, I was not a fan. For many years, it hung to the left of the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. At Easter time, it would be place in the Narthex (the cross still hangs there). I often thought how we, as parishioners, rejected that image of Christ in our church, just as He was rejected on Good Friday. Father Bill, a wise man, brought it out as a reminder. I do believe it was lost on many of us (me included). It took years for me to come to that realization. It has opened my eyes to what I experience on my daily journey; God isn't always how we picture Him. As Mother Teresa said, "See the face of God in everyone."

Thank you for allowing me to share my thoughts. Be open to the blessings all around us!

# 2025 Spring Bible Study / Retreat



So far we have done four bible studies in the parish since the spring of 2023: *Oremus* by Fr. Mark Toups, *The Overview of the Bible* by Fr. Tony Stanganelli, *The Biblical Walk Through the Mass* by Dr. Edward Sri and *The Eucharist* by Bishop Robert Barron.






