# Preparing for Lent March 5<sup>th</sup> - April 16<sup>th</sup>

Lent is a beautiful season the Church has given us to help prepare our souls to celebrate the most important event in the history of the world: the passion, death, and resurrection of our Savior, Jesus Christ. The first day of Lent is always Ash Wednesday, in which we use ashes on our forehead in the shape of a cross to remember our own mortality and begin our journey of penance.

Each year, Lent is an opportunity to renew our Christian faith, and we are encouraged to use prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (the Three Pillars of Lent) as the means to grow in our relationship with God.

Prayer: If you don't have a daily prayer habit, Lent is the perfect time to begin. If you do, you can add a devotion or practice that will enhance your Lenten preparations

Fasting: The Church only requires that we abstain from meat every Friday in Lent and on Ash Wednesday, and that we fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, eating only one full meal plus snacks that only add up to another meal. But fasting can be much broader than that. It may look like giving up things like gossip, your favorite coffee order, or forgoing music in the car and replacing it with prayer. The goal of "offering something up for Lent" is to turn our minds to God. So if you offer up listening to music while driving, try replacing it with prayers or with a Catholic podcast. Fast from social media, especially if you find you're on it too much, and spend that time in prayer or talking to a friend.

Almsgiving: Almsgiving reminds us of Jesus's call to serve and connects us in solidarity with our brothers and sisters in need. It traditionally refers to helping the poor financially, but by extension, we can help anyone in need by our actions, as well.

In contrast to Advent, Lent is a solemn season when the sacrament of reconciliation—where we ask God for forgiveness—becomes more of a focus. It's a time when Catholics discover how to confess—and the power of God's forgiveness.

The Stations of the Cross, taking place on Fridays during Lent, allow us to pray and reflect upon Jesus's final hours.

More solemn songs replace celebratory hymns during Mass.

Prepare your home - Think about what will help you and your family focus on Lent and put something in your home that will remind you every day: a purple table cloth; a display with a crown of thorns; holy water by your door.

There is no better time to reconnect with or deepen one's faith than Lent. During this time, we can draw closer to God as we prepare for the joyous celebration of Christ's resurrection at Faster.

# **Gospel Reflection**

Luke 6:27-38

"To go beyond instinct, to go beyond hatred," Pope Francis suggests, is fundamental. However bad it gets, Jesus calls on us to see those who wrong us as God sees them: as creatures loved into existence, still capable of good.



Understandably, we find this challenging. But, as the Pope points out, Jesus faced such situations himself and shows us what turning the cheek really means.

By not trading strike for strike, Jesus avoids becoming like those who struck him in the first place. Jesus does not give in to injustice. Rather, he reveals it.

During his Passion, as the Pope explains, Jesus "asks for an account of the wrong done to him." He calls it out, gently but firmly. "With his question," the Pope affirm, "Jesus denounces what is unjust. But he does so without anger, without violence, indeed with kindness."

In any conflict, whether personal or international, we are therefore called to unmask the absurdity of hatred by being the "one who has a greater inner strength," to use our voice rather than fists, or gestures rather than words.

Ultimately, as the Pope declares: "Turning the other cheek does not have to mean suffering in silence, giving in to injustice." It means transforming the moment to bring light to the darkness.





2025 is the Jubilee Holy Year, the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord, an "event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church." The concept of "Jubilee" has its origins in the Book of Leviticus (chapter 25) as a special year of reconciliation, pilgrimage, and coming home.

Pope Francis has designated the 2025 Holy Year as a time to renew ourselves as "Pilgrims of Hope."

# What are the Holy Doors All About?

From a symbolic viewpoint, the Holy Door takes on a special significance: it is the most powerful sign of the Jubilee, since the ultimate aim of the pilgrim is to pass through it. The opening of the door by the Pope constitutes the official beginning of the Holy Year. Originally, there was only one door, at the Basilica of St. John Lateran, which is the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome. Later, to allow as many pilgrims as possible to take part in the Jubilee experience, the other Roman Basilicas also opened their own holy doors.

In crossing the threshold of the Holy Door, the pilgrim is reminded of the passage from chapter 10 of St John's gospel: "I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture." Passing through the Holy Door expresses the decision to follow and be guided by Jesus, who is the Good Shepherd. The door is a passageway that ushers the pilgrim into the interior of a church. For the Christian community, a church is not only a sacred space, to be approached with respect, with appropriate behavior and dress code, but it is a symbol of the communion that binds every believer to Christ: it is a place of encounter and dialogue, of reconciliation and peace which awaits every pilgrim, the Church is essentially the place of the community of the faithful.

In Rome, this experience takes on a special significance because of the special links between the Eternal City and Saints Peter and Paul, the apostles who founded the Christian community in Rome and whose teachings and example are models for the universal Church. The tombs of Saints Peter and Paul are located in Rome, they were martyred here; and together with the catacombs, these sacred sites are places of continuous spiritual inspiration.



# Saints of the Week



February 27th
Saint Gregory of Narek,
Abbot and Doctor of the Church

Born about 950 in the historic Armenian district of Andzevatsik, Gregory grew up in a family that encouraged learning. As a youth he entered Narek Monastery which Ananias, his mother's great-uncle, governed as abbot. He enrolled in the monastery's renowned school and there, as priest and abbot, he spent his whole life which was on fire with love for the Virgin Mary. He attained the height of holiness and mystical experience and displayed his learning in various works of mystical theology. In the year 1003 he produced his celebrated Book of Lamentations, and about two years later he died.



The Shroud of Turin is the most analyzed artifact in the world and yet remains a mystery. The **SHROUD ENCOUNTER** is a fast-moving, big-screen experience using over 200 images. The program is a production of the Shroud of Turin Education Project, Inc. and will be presented by international expert and author, Russ Breault.

There have been many tests and studies done in modern times to authenticate its origins. As recently as 2022, new scientific techniques were done to further counter inconclusive carbon dating tests performed in the 1980s attempting to discredit the artifact.
